


# Mullion CP News



## <u>Primary Pupil Acceptable Use</u> <u>Agreement</u>

Dear Parents & Carers,

Your children will be bringing home a copy of the Primary Pupil Acceptable User Agreement. This document will be signed by all pupils in the Southerly Point Cooperative Multi Academy Trust. All staff are also to sign something similar. It is necessary for it to be a universal message for pupils from the age of 3 to 11 and therefore it is important that younger children have the opportunity to talk to adults about it. It is essential that this agreement is in place for two very simple reasons;

- 1. To keep your child safe when using the computers in school.
- 2. To maintain the school ICT system as a safe place for your pupils.




