

The geography of the county and its rurality make it hard to find everyone, so it is likely that the actual number of people sleeping out is higher than that.

After a few reports of head lice last week, please see a parent's fail safe treatment.

Cover the child's hair in conditioner (any type, even cheap conditioner will do). You will need at least 125ml to 250ml.

Then cover child's hair with a carrier bag (like a turban) or cling film, and make sure there is no air under the bag. ( Never leave a child unattended with plastic bags.)

## DO NOT LEAVE CHILDREN UNATTENDED WITH CARRIER BAGS.

Leave on for about an hour.

Remove the bag and comb the hair out over a sink or bath. Keep combing for about half an hour. Any lice will be suffocated and come out in the bath.

Rinse out conditioner and shampoo/dry as normal.
