Dear Parents,

Last week we were lucky to appoint Miss Warwick who will join the team as a teacher one day per week in year 6.

The uniforms are all now available from Whirlwind Sports Helston branch on 01326 564297. From September we will be rigorously enforcing the new uniform policy. This will mean:

Black sensible shoes, no makeup (including nail varnish), long hair to be tied up, no jewellery other than a watch and or medical bracelet. This will make it much easier for pupils to concentrate and ensure their safety at school.

A few parents in key stage one have asked if the school sends home year 2 SATs results in the same format as year 6. This is not the case we do not want to place pressure on pupils by sending these results home in isolation. The SATs in year 2 are used solely to inform teacher assessment. These teacher assessments are the assessment grades on your child's school report.

Over the summer you may see people coming into school. We are having toilets in key stage 2 renovated and new fencing to the front of the school carpark. It is hoped that in the new year we will begin work on the infant toilets.

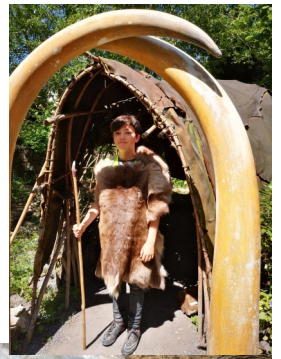

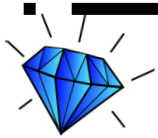


CHEDDAR **GORGE & CAVES**

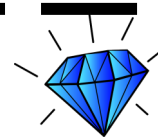
