We take our role in supporting and challenging pupils very seriously and talk to them frequently in class, assemblies and individually about our expectations

How we talk to children about behaviour is vital. It is important that we are clear about what is acceptable behaviour, and importantly whom they should speak to if they are unhappy or feel that they are being treated unfairly.

When talking to pupils we often ask

What happened? When it happened Who was involved? How many times this has happened What length of time this has been happening for.

In talking specifically about bullying, we use the following definition

## It is on purpose

It has happened more than once It is designed to hurt either emotionally or physically

The children at our school are caring and thoughtful of others and we see many positive examples of this each day - Opening doors for each other, supporting each other in their work, cheering at sports day, sharing equipment. We are proud of our happy and caring school. We are also aware that at times friendships do go wrong and understand that pupils will need support in creating positive relationships.
