**Year 6 Leavers Assembly**


Year 6 Leavers Assembly will be on 21st July 2022 from 2.00 - 3.00 pm.





In geography the children found Cornwall on a map of the UK and talked about Cornish culture and tradition. Next week we will begin our learning about Giants, Monsters, Mermaids and Piskies.
