Dear Parents

Thanks again to all those parents who attended the consultation about the school uniform policy. I spoke with the pupils in an assembly about uniform, its essential role in portraying a proud single identity for the school and that it should be practical, safe and affordable. The children may want to speak with you about this at home. I did say that the next stage in the process is for me to show them a sample of the uniforms so they are reassured that there is no change to the policy other than the introduction of a coloured PE shirt. I did mention that there will be a period where they may have clothes already bought (especially shoes) that don't fit our policy. As a school we will be sensitive to this but also will be asking all parents to support this policy once it is finalised. I am hoping that the samples will be in school next week and that the new policy will be available to read on the website at the start of next term. The school will be enforcing the policy from September.

It has been another busy week in school with sporting events taking place. A football team went to Mullion Comprehensive to take part in a competition on Thursday and a number of children took part in the Cross Country Event at Coose Trannack last Saturday.

Year 6 had a visit from Mrs Mathias to talk about their transition to the high school. 
