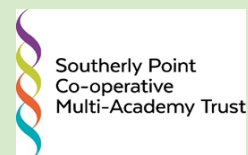

# CLUBS

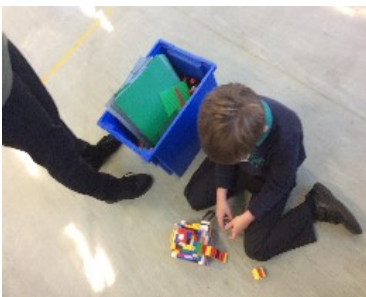
