


Lockdown procedures

The main changes to the behaviour policy are the introduction of a yellow, red and report card system.

- Children may receive a warning if they are disrupting learning in the class, if the behaviour is not modified this becomes a yellow card and a final warning. If the behaviour continues a red card is issued, the head teacher or assistant will be informed and they will speak with the pupil. Parents will be informed if pupils receive a red card. This is an exceptional situation and will be regarded as serious by the school.
- A red card can be issued as a first response if the situation is deemed serious. (such a case would be violence to others.)
- Report cards pupils would report to a senior member of staff after each morning and afternoon session. This would be to reinforce positive messages and support the pupil in modifying their behaviour.

These sanctions will be used after all the usual reminders and strategies have been used. These changes will not affect the vast majority of the pupils in school and are designed to ensure pupils can learn effectively and safely in school. Parents will be kept informed of incidents where cards are issued.

On Thursday we will have a visit from Mrs Shona Pye who will introduce the pupils to the virtues in education approach. This is a project that helps pupils and the school develop positive characteristics. On Jan 25th Shona will hold a parents assembly to introduce you to the scheme and for the pupils to award parents with a 'jewel' illustrating a positive characteristic that they see in their families. The virtues will replace the R time assemblies. We will award certificates for pupils who demonstrate positive personal characteristics. I look forward to seeing you at the assembly. Until that date we will continue with the R Time awards.

PARENT PAY

All 2019 residentials have now been set up on parent pay for parents who want to start paying earlier. Anyone needing a barcode to pay cash in the village can let the school office know.

WAVES




