Year Group	End of Year Expectations			
Year 1 Pupils should be taught to:	• sit correctly at a table, holding a pencil comfortably and correctly			
	· form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the			
	right place			
	· form capital letters			
	• form digits 0-9			
	· understand which letters belong to which handwriting 'families' (i.e. letters			
	that are formed in similar ways)			
	· leave spaces between words.			
Year 2 Pupils should be taught to:	• form lower-case letters of the correct size relative to one another			
	· start using some of the diagonal and horizontal strokes needed to join			
	letters and understand which letters, when adjacent to one another, are			
	best left unjoined			
	<ul> <li>write capital letters and digits of the correct size, orientation and relationship</li> </ul>			
	to one another and to lower case letters			
	· use spacing between words that reflects the size of the letters.			
Years 3 and 4 Pupils should be taught to:	· use the diagonal and horizontal strokes that are needed to join letters and			
	understand which letters, when adjacent to one another, are best left unjoined			
	· increase the legibility, consistency and quality of their handwriting (e.g. ensure			
	downstrokes of letters are parallel and equidistant; lines of writing are spaced			
	sufficiently so that the ascenders and descenders of letters do not touch).			
Years 5 and 6 Pupils should be taught to:	· write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed by:			
	- choosing which shape of a letter to use when given choices			
	- deciding whether or not to join specific letters			
	- choosing the writing implement that is best suited for a task.
