On average, one in every ten people will have dyslexia, and this makes it difficult to meet the demands of conventional education, despite often being intelligent and creative. Thank you so much to our teachers and TAs who have earned this vote of confidence by their understanding of individual needs and willingness to make sure that we do our best for all our children.

our Writers' Workshop sessions.
















SHELLS AND PEBBLES

A group of KS1 children took part in the Multi Skills event at Mullion School on Wednesday. Fun was had by everyone, Well done KS1 children!










