Thank you for your co operation in meeting the deposit deadline.

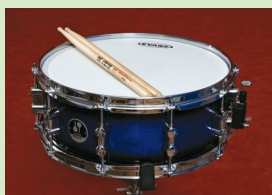
KS1 VISIT CO OP

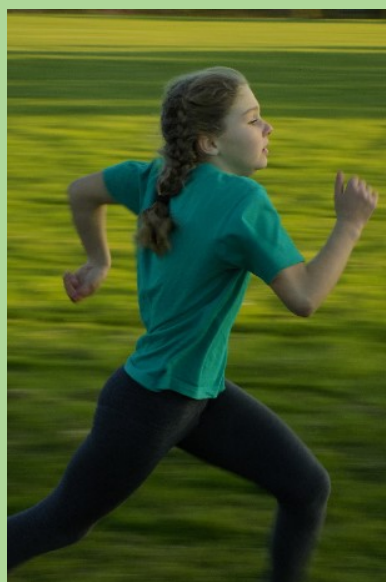
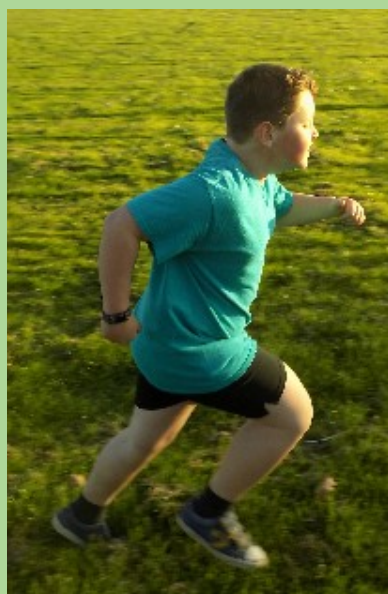
Footprints, Waves and Surfers – Chocolate
