Passion Project

You will complete a 'passion project'. This should be about something that interests you. This is a project to really get yourself stuck into — and to develop the virtue of 'pride' in. Time management will be key — don't expect to get it all done to a high standard in one go. Map out your plan for the next few weeks.

How to Plan and Execute a 'Passion Project':

Step I: Make a list of everything that you really enjoy and take pride in. From this list, choose one thing which will be your chosen project.

Step 2: To make this manageable, think of <u>one</u> question you would like to explore about this passion you have. You must keep returning to this to ensure that the project is focussed.

Step 3: Research to explore more about this <u>one</u> question. This could be by reading books, searching on the internet, asking people or even visiting somewhere. Make notes, draw pictures and do anything you need to help you understand as much as you can about your question.

Step 4: Create a project board to present your passion project. This should be <u>at least</u> 80cm x 60cm in size and be presented to a high standard. This may include pictures (some photographs, some of your own creation) and text. All text should be handwritten (fully joined and neat) and be written to the Year 4/5 expected standard.

Step 5: Share! Practice presenting your project at home to your family and friends. You should be able to talk about your passion with confidence and enthusiasm. Think about how you will present each feature in a way that will both inform and entertain the audience.

As this is a larger project, I have given you ample time and spread it over the half term. I am expecting **everyone** to participate. When these are in school, you will be presenting them to a group. I can't wait to see and hear about something that you are passionate about!
